



Announcement from Prasat Police Station.

Regarding the anti-bribery policy. (Anti-Bribery Policy) And refusal to accept gifts, presents, or any other benefits (No Gift Policy) from practice Duties for the fiscal year 2026.

According to Section 128, paragraph one, of the Organic Act on Prevention and Suppression of Corruption B.E. 2561 (2018), no government official shall accept any property or other benefit that can be calculated in monetary terms from anyone, other than property or benefits rightfully due according to laws, rules, or regulations issued under the authority of the law, except for the acceptance of property or other benefits. By virtue of ethics, according to the criteria and number determined by the NACC and the Code of Ethics for Police Officers 2021, Section 2(2) being honest and upright, performing duties according to the law, regulations and procedures of the Royal Thai Police with transparency, not showing behavior that is indicative of seeking undue advantage, being responsible for duties and human rights, being ready to be audited and held accountable, having a good conscience, considering society, and Section 2(4) thinking more about the public interest than personal interest, having a public spirit. Working together, cooperating, and making sacrifices for the common good and creating benefits for society, coupled with the National Reform Plan on Prevention and Suppression of Corruption and Misconduct (Revised Edition), which defines key reform activities, Activity 4: Developing a transparent and conflict-of-interested Thai civil service system, Goal 1, Clause 1.1: All government agencies shall declare themselves as agencies where all government officials will not accept any gifts or presents of any kind in the performance of their duties. (No Gift Policy)

Therefore, to prevent conflicts of interest, and to avoid accepting bribes, gifts, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties, guidelines for combating bribery (Anti-Bribery Policy) and refraining from accepting gifts or other benefits (No Gift Policy) in the performance of duties have been established. The details are as follows:

objective

1. To prevent or reduce the likelihood of bribery and conflicts of interest in various forms among police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station.

2. To promote awareness among police officers at Prasat Police Station to refuse all gifts and presents in the performance of their duties.

3. To build a strong and sustainable organizational culture of integrity and transparency within the civil service system.

4. To establish measures, guidelines, and mechanisms for preventing the giving/receiving of bribes or other benefits.

5. To establish guidelines for the acceptance of entertainment expenses or gifts by executives and police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station, in accordance with relevant laws and regulations.

6. To support and enhance the implementation of the national strategy, the master plan under the national strategy, and the national reform plan in the area of preventing and suppressing corruption and misconduct, as well as to be part of the approach to assessing integrity and transparency in government agencies.(Integrity and Transparency Assessment : ITA)

Scope of application

This applies to all police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station.

Definition

"Bribery" refers to property or other benefits given to a person to induce them to perform or refrain from performing an act in their official capacity, whether or not such act is lawful, as desired by the payer. This includes gifts, presents, facilitation fees, tokens of goodwill, donations, entertaining, and similar benefits when offered, given, or received in a manner that can be reasonably considered a bribe, and also includes gifts or receipts made after the fact.

"Gifts, presents, or other benefits that affect the performance of duties" means money, property, services, or other benefits of value, including tips, received by a government official in addition to their salary, income, or normal government benefits, and which influence their decision-making, approval, permission, or any other action in the performance of duties in a manner that facilitates corruption for the giver of the gift, whether in the past, at the time of receipt, or in the future.

"Assets" refer to tangible and intangible objects that may have monetary value and can be held, such as money, houses, cars, and stocks.

"Accepting property or other benefits in a morally acceptable manner" means accepting property or other benefits from relatives or from individuals who give them on various occasions, normally according to customs, traditions, or culture, or given as a matter of courtesy practiced in society. /Relative means

"Relatives" refers to ancestors, descendants, siblings sharing the same parents or one parent, uncles, grandparents, spouses, the ancestors or descendants of the spouse, adopted children, or adoptive parents.

"Other benefits" means anything that has value, such as price reductions, entertainment, services, training, or anything else of a similar nature.

"Performing duties" means the actions or performance of duties by a government official in a position appointed or assigned to perform a particular duty, or to act as a substitute in a particular duty, both generally and specifically, as a police officer whose powers and duties are prescribed by law, or actions carried out in accordance with the powers and duties prescribed by law for police officers.

"Commander" means a person who has the authority and responsibility to order, supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under their command.

"Subordinates" refers to all police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station, excluding their superiors.

Guidelines for preventing bribery

1. All police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station are prohibited from being involved in giving or receiving bribes of any kind, whether directly or indirectly.

2. All police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station are prohibited from soliciting or accepting bribes for their own personal benefit or the benefit of others.

3. Adhere to the anti-corruption policy and refrain from any involvement in corruption, whether directly or indirectly.

4. Performing duties must be done strictly in accordance with police regulations, rules of conduct, and relevant laws.

5. Do not engage in any act that constitutes giving or receiving bribes.

6. Oversee the disbursement of expenses by subordinate agencies to ensure strict compliance with all relevant laws and regulations.

7. All donations or support, whether in the form of money, materials, or assets, for any activity or project must strictly comply with all regulations, rules, and announcements. A receipt or proof of payment must be included with every report.

8. Regarding the acceptance of property or other benefits in a morally upright manner, all police officers under the jurisdiction of Prasat Police Station shall strictly adhere to the Announcement of the National Anti-Corruption Commission regarding the Criteria for Accepting Property or Other Benefits in a Morally Upright Manner by Officials, B.E. (2020).

Measures for handling policy violations.

1. Failure to comply with this policy may result in disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, or other relevant legal proceedings. This includes direct supervisors who neglect to address the wrongdoing or are aware of it but fail to take appropriate action, with disciplinary penalties up to dismissal from government service.

2. Failure to be aware of this policy announcement and/or related laws cannot be used as an excuse for non-compliance.

3. Commanders, as per Police Department Order No. 1212/2537 dated October 1, 1994, have the authority and responsibility to supervise and ensure that their subordinates strictly adhere to and follow this policy.

Monitoring measures

1. The Superintendent of Prasat Police Station declares his intention to manage the station with honesty, integrity, transparency, and in accordance with the principles of good governance. This declaration will be disseminated to all police officers under his command and to external stakeholders.

2. Commanders acting under the Police Department Order No. 1212/2537 dated October 1, 1994, shall have the authority and responsibility to supervise, monitor, and inspect subordinate police officers under their command to ensure compliance with this announcement. In case of any violation of this announcement, the commander shall report it promptly to the Superintendent of Prasat Police Station.

3. Prasat Police Station shall review and revise its operational guidelines as appropriate or in response to significant changes in various factors.

4. The administrative division of Prasat Police Station shall compile statistics on the acceptance of bribes, gifts, or other benefits in the performance of official duties, along with any problems or obstacles encountered, and report this information to the Superintendent of Prasat Police Station every quarter.

Measures for protecting complainants/whistleblowers/witnesses and maintaining confidentiality.

1. When considering complaints, a level of secrecy must be determined and those involved protected in accordance with the Regulations on the Protection of Official Secrets B.E. ๒๕๔๔ (๒๐๐๑). When referring matters to the relevant agency for consideration, the informant and the complainant may experience hardship. For example, complaints alleging wrongdoing by a government official should initially be considered classified information. Anonymous complaints should only be considered if they provide supporting evidence. In cases where the circumstances are clear and the witnesses are clearly identified, information regarding influential individuals must be kept confidential. The name and address of the informant must notify the relevant authorities if this is not done. The following protection must be provided: "The commanding officer shall exercise discretion and issue appropriate orders to protect the informant, witnesses, and individuals providing information for the investigation, ensuring they are not harmed or endangered." It is unfair that complaints, testimony, or information may arise. If the accused is named, both the complainant and the accused must be protected because the matter has not yet gone through a fact-finding process and may constitute malicious accusation causing distress and damage. Furthermore, the complainant's complaint should specify this in the petition. Please keep the name of the complainant confidential or withheld from disclosure. The agency must not disclose the complainant's name to the respondent agency because the complainant may suffer harm as a result of the complaint.

2. Upon filing a complaint, the complainant and witnesses will not be subjected to any actions that affect their work or livelihood. If any action is necessary, such as separating workplaces to prevent the complainant, witnesses, and accused from meeting, the consent of both the complainant and witnesses must be obtained.

3. Requests from victims, claimants, or witnesses, such as requests for a change of workplace or methods for preventing or resolving problems, should be considered by the responsible person or agency as appropriate.
